- 45 upper-division credit hours (3000-4999 level)
- 2.0 CU cumulative GPA

Reasoning Skills (3-4 hours)	• See Degree Audit ◦ MATH 1040 is recommended, and if taken, will complete this requirement with ECON 2810 (a required course for the major).	
Core Humanities (3 hours)	• HUM 3990 ◦ This course also fulfills Navigate and one Writing Intensive course.	
Natural Science Lab (1 hour)	• See Degree Audit ◦ This can be taken as part of an Explore – PNW course that has a lab component	
Oral Communication	• See Degree Audit ◦ This course may also fulfill general education or major requirements.
