- 120 credit hours
- 45 upper-division credit hours (3000-4999 level)
- 2.0 CU cumulative GPA
- Residency: At least 30 credit hours of the degree must be completed while registered in the College of Letters, Arts, and Sciences at UCCS.

Major Requirements			
Interdisciplinary Studies Major – Cybersecurity Option (36 hours) • Requires a minimum of 18 credit hours of core course work, and an additional 18 hours in a Concentration Area. • Requires a minimum of 24 credit hours of upper-division (3000+ level) course work. • All courses must be completed with a grade of "C-" or better. • A minimum 2.0 GPA must be maintained in all Cybersecurity course work taken toward the degree. *NOTE 1: INDS 4660 may be taken for 1 credit hour if a Capstone course is taken for the Concentration Area that does not fulfill the Compass Curriculum Summit requirement. **NOTE 2: Additional courses may be approved to fulfill this requirement. Please contact your academic advisor for more information ***NOTE 3: The GIS concentration area requires an additional 6 hours of course work which will apply toward general elective credits or the GIScience undergraduate certificate.
