- 2.0 CU cumulative GPA

Women's & Ethnic Studies Double Major • Requires a minimum of 30-31 credit hours of WEST course work and a minimum of 21 credit hours of upper-division (3000+ level) WEST course work. • All WEST courses must have a grade of "C" or better. *NOTE 1: If the WEST Standard Track Summit Experience is chosen, both courses must be taken together in the same semester. **NOTE 2: If the WEST Honors Track Summit Experience is chosen, WEST 4980 must be taken in the semester prior to WEST 4990.
