### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

UCCS **does not** have a dental medicine program. **Pre-Dentistry Prep** is **not** a major or a minor, but a listing of prerequisite courses and recommendations needed to be eligible for admission into CU School of Dental Medicine at the Anschutz Medical Campus in Aurora, CO. A college program leading to a bachelor's degree is considered by the faculty and the CU School of Dental Medicine's Committee on Admissions to offer the best preparation for a student interested in Dental Medicine. Students in the preprofessional program are advised to choose a major and plan to graduate with a bachelor's degree from UCCS.

Other programs may have different requirements. Students should check admissions requirements for all schools to which they plan to apply. Completion of prerequisite coursework does not guarantee acceptance into any professional degree.
