



Minimum GPA: Your cumulative GPA, including all college level course work completed anywhere, must be 3.0 or higher at the end of the spring semester during which you are completing the clinical application. IMPORTANT: If your cumulative GPA is less than 3.0 after the final semester update, you will not be considered for admission to the Clinical Nursing Program, even if you have taken and passed the entrance exam.

Current Active Students: Applicants must be active at UCCS in the spring semester that they apply to clinicals.
